- **Local Law #1-2002: Fixing Sewer Rents for the Year 2003 in Sewer District No. 1 and Sewer District No. 2 of the Town of Delaware**

LOCAL LAW #1-2002 – A LOCAL LAW FIXING SEWER RENTS FOR THE YEAR 2003 IN SEWER DISTRICT NO. 1 AND SEWER DISTRICT NO. 2 OF THE TOWN OF DELAWARE: The following resolution was introduced by Councilwoman Boyle, who moved its adoption, and seconded by Councilman Baum, to wit:

SECTION I
Purpose

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Article 14-F of the General Municipal Law and Section VI (C) of the Sewer Rent Law of the Town of Delaware, New York (Local Law No. 2 of 1997), in order to fix and determine the per unit rates to be charged for the year 2003 in Sewer District No. 1 and Sewer District No. 2 of the Town of Delaware.

SECTION II
Sewer Rent Rates for the Year 2003

- A. The following rates shall be charged in the Town of Delaware Sewer District No. 1 during the year 2003 for sewer rent:

Operation and Maintenance	\$385.87
Capital	<u>49.24</u>
Total	\$435.11

- B. The following rates shall be charged in the Town of Delaware Sewer District No. 2 during the year 2003 for sewer rent:

Operation and Maintenance	\$295.61
Capital	<u>106.09</u>
Total	\$401.70

SECTION III
Effect of Invalidity

If any clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or any part of this local law shall for any reason be adjusted finally by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation and effect to the clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or any part thereof, directly involved in the controversy or action in which such judgment shall have

been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that the remainder of this local law would have been adopted had any such provision not be included.

SECTION IV
Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State.

The question of the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly put to a vote on roll call, resulting as follows:
